

The Ufford Arts Festival - Young Ufford Filmmaker Competition

Ufford Arts Festival Team are particularly excited to be holding our first Young Ufford Filmmaker Competition.

We are looking for imaginative and original short films made by young people to be screened as part of the Ufford Arts Festival

The films or videos, which should be shorter than 10 minutes, can be about anything at all! Fact, fiction, comedy, drama, news, music video, documentary, nature, or animations such as Claymation, cartoon, or stop-motion. However, it would be helpful to avoid topics that might not be suitable for young viewers.

A prize voucher, and certificate will be presented to the UAF Young Filmmaker in each age category:

- Under 11
- 11 – 21 years

The best short film entries will be shown during the Arts Festival Weekend.

COMPETITION RULES

- The Ufford Young Filmmaker competition is organised by the Ufford Arts Festival for Young People based in and around the village of Ufford
- The competition exhibits short films made by children and young people (21 & under).
- We welcome submissions from individuals or a small group of friends
- Although we understand these projects are often mentored by adults the production must be led by young people and they must have devised the script/story. Naturally, there is greater leeway for the youngest children.
- Films submitted must be no longer than 10 minutes in duration.
- All entries must be received digitally – full details given below
- There is a maximum of two film submissions per entrant
- The competition deadline Friday 2th September 2022.
- A panel of a film professional film maker, educator, and a young person's representative will judge each entry and their decision is final.
- The films will be exhibited during the 2022 Ufford Arts Festival, although we reserve the right not to include any films that do not comply with our rules
- Entrants need to obtain all permissions from everyone (or the parent/guardian of any young persons) appearing in the film and any associated photo/still images.
- It is also your responsibility to ensure you have the right to show the film to a public audience (ie that you have secured all music and image rights). Please do not submit a film until you have permission to use the music/images in your film
- In submitting your film and by signing the entry form you agree to all the competition regulations and confirm that all the information in the form is true and accurate.
- Please make sure the spelling of all the names of cast/crew are correct on the entry form.
